- Cloud: AWS Solutions Architect / Azure Administrator.
 - Cybersecurity: CompTIA Security+ / CISSP (if security focused).
 - Project Management: PMP / PRINCE2 / CSM.
 - Data: Google Data Analytics / Microsoft Power BI.
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5. Networking & Personal Branding

- Update **LinkedIn profile** with new skills & headline.
 - Start posting **insights/mini-blogs** twice a week on LinkedIn.
 - Join **online IT communities** (Reddit, Discord, GitHub).
 - Attend at least **1 webinar/conference per quarter**.
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6. Job Strategy

- Revamp Resume with **skills + achievements + keywords**.
 - Apply to **mid-to-senior roles**, not just entry level.
 - Be open to **contract, remote, or freelance work**.
 - Explore **mentorship or coaching opportunities**.
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7. Financial & Career Planning

- Build **6–12 months emergency fund**.
 - Start a **side income stream** (consulting, freelancing, blogging).
 - Align **retirement planning** with career decisions.
 - Balance **work-life-health** for long-term sustainability.
